



### Vicar's three minute reflection

#### TRUE WORSHIP

Worship evolved from the Anglo Saxon "weorthscipe" which means "to give worth to something". Worship is giving to someone the honour or worth that is due to them. To worship God is to give Him the glory, honour and adoration that is due to Him. I have no hesitation in saying that the greatest ministry of the church is its worship of the great "I am". And true worship takes place when

men and women agree that God should sit not only on the throne of the universe but also on the throne of their hearts. William Temple, a former Archbishop of Canterbury, wrote these words concerning worship. "Worship is the submission of all our nature to God. It is the quickening of conscience by His holiness, the

nourishment of mind with His beauty, the opening of the heart by His love, the surrender of the will to His purpose, and all this is gathered up in adoration to the most selfless emotion of which our nature is capable and therefore the chief remedy for that self-centredness which is the original sin and the source of actual sin."

Often times, we think that when we worship God, we give Him something which He craves like a vain woman wanting compliments. No! God instructs us to worship Him because He knows that as we open the door of our hearts in worship, He can come through the same door and make His presence known. It is opening ourselves to the necessary luxury of enjoying God, as the old theologians put it, "to worship God and not enjoy Him is impossible."

In worship we meet the power of God and stand in its strengthening. If you've made a habit of communing with God when the sun is shining, you will find it much easier to sing in the rain. If we haven't learned to be worshippers, it doesn't really matter how well we do anything else. (continued next page)

The church of the twenty first century, if is to honour God, must first of all be a worshipping church. Where does praise, which is often misrepresented as "worship", fit in? A.W. Tozer writing on the subject of worship said this about "praise": "Praise is thanking God for what He does; worship is adoring Him for who He is." The materialistic and self-centred nature of today's society has a strong influence on our attitude to life and things and this has been extended to our worship of God when we come before Him. There's always the tendency to think more of getting than giving. We feel less concerned with how we can give to Him the adoration He deserves.

God wants worshippers before workers; indeed the only acceptable workers are those who have learned the lost art of worship. This is so because it is only when we begin to worship that we begin to grow. Worship is pictured in Isaiah 6 when the young prophet became aware of the Father, aware of his own limitations, aware of the Father's directives and aware of the task at hand.

In closing, I will quote Charles R Swindoll who says: "What comes from the Lord because it is impossible for humans to manufacture it? Wisdom. What comes from humans because it is impossible for the Lord to experience it? Worry. And what is it that brings wisdom and dispels worry? WORSHIP." Worship helps us to see God in the midst of our troubled lives.

To the surprise of the gawking bachelors, the young man replied, "No sir."


Puzzled and a little hurt, the tycoon asked, "Well then, son, what *do* you want?"

## The Day God settled the "Bible Question" for Billy Graham (II)

#### Foothills of faith

Despite his assertion to the contrary, doubt continued to haunt Graham. In August, Christian educator Henrietta Mears invited him to address an audience at her Forest Home retreat center, located east of Los Angeles. Graham's shaken faith gave him pause, but he nonetheless obliged.

Mears was a phenomenon in Southern California's celebrity culture. Impeccably dressed, jewel-adorned, and wealthy, she grew up in William Bell Riley's Minneapolis church. After moving west, Mears transformed First Presbyterian Church of Hollywood's Sunday school program, increasing enrolment from 450 to 4,500.

While he prepared to speak at Forest Home, Graham and Mears spoke about his doubts. She understood liberal theology. But unlike Templeton, she found the arguments unconvincing. The ease and authority with which she wielded Scripture comforted Graham.

Still, many of Graham's questions remained unanswered. Did Noah actually build an ark to survive a great flood? Could a whale really have swallowed Jonah? Pondering these miracles, Graham roamed into the foothills of the nearby San Bernardino Mountains. With the moon shining, he wandered off the trail, opened his Bible on a tree stump, and took his concerns to God. Inexplicably, the burden lifted.

"Father, I am going to accept this as thy Word—by faith!" Graham proclaimed. "I'm going to allow faith to go beyond my intellectual questions and doubts, and I will believe this to be your inspired Word."

Tears streaming down his face, Graham returned to Forest Home. Though he didn't have an explanation for every biblical oddity, for the first time in months he felt powerful intimacy with God and renewed confidence in the Scripture he proclaimed.

## Billy Graham continued

#### The road not taken

As for Templeton, he finished his graduate work at Princeton, then became an evangelist for the National Council of Churches. Princeton's dean even considered him "the most gifted and talented young man in American today for preaching mission work." But it wasn't long before Templeton admitted that he no longer believed in any sort of meaningful Christianity. He left the NCC and ultimately moved to Toronto where he became a prominent media personality, writing newspaper columns and providing television commentary.

For much of his life he remained friends with Graham, but Templeton never returned to the faith of his youth. Just two years before his death in 2001, he published a critique of Christianity titled *Farewell to God: My Reasons for Rejecting the Christian Faith*.

Graham's life needs no such explanation. Mere months after his breakthrough in the mountains, Graham's Los Angeles crusade made him a household name in America and launched an extraordinary evangelistic career. Today a simple bronze plaque marks the spot where Graham submitted once and for all to the authority of Scripture.
